Beginning next week, we are going to trial window visits for residents and their families so you can see one another. We will bring your loved one to a large window where you can see them. We will schedule visits every













other week to make sure all residents and families have this opportunity. If you choose to have a window visit, it will replace that week's zoom call. In preparation for window visits, please:

- Schedule visits in advance by contacting Reception
- Visit for no more than 15 minutes
- When you book, please give us your cell number and bring your phone to the visit; we will have a phone available so your loved one can talk with you

As precautionary measure, we will place a mask on your loved one during transfer from their suite to the designated meeting area. Visits will be rescheduled if your loved one is in isolation or if the situation arises that the centre is in outbreak.

Safety precautions

We continue to adhere to all the orders issued by the Chief Medical Officer of Health to prevent outbreak at Wing Kei. This includes screening staff when they arrive, monitoring residents very closely, sanitizing all areas with strong disinfectants, ensuring physical distancing during activities, and more. Recently, we have instituted two more safety measures:

- Staff are wearing face shields while on the unit to provide extra protection—a big thank you to them for adjusting to the face shields so quickly
- Staff are wiping the bottom of their shoes on a sanitization mat upon their arrival to work
