Poor air quality due to wildfire

Our teams have been working hard to protect our residents and keep them as comfortable as possible despite the poor air quality from the wildfire in Alberta.

As of today, Environment Canada is reporting Air Quality Health Index values of 10+, which is considered "very high risk". For the safety of our residents and everyone in the facilities, partial Code Grey has been announced and the following protective measures have been implemented in our facilities:

- Single entry for staff and visitors and please only use the main entrance
- All windows are closed
- High-efficiency particulate air (HEPA) filter system has been deployed
- All outdoor activities are restricted
- Signage posted and announcements made in the facilities

Please be assured that safety is our top priority. We will closely monitor the situation and implement necessary actions and provide information for the Wing Kei community as required. Thank you in advance for your kind support and cooperation.
